The study used Scientometrics parameters, and the period was restricted from 1979 to 2024. The study is based on literature published on self-reliant India and raw data was retrieved from the SCOPUS database with proper search string. The study found that increasing trend of literature on 'self-reliant' after 2019 and Lotka's law reveals, 0.934% of the authors (466 authors) have one publication. The CSIR-National Physical Laboratory has greater number of documents and stimulating finding is that India has secured top rank in terms of literature production on self-reliant.
