



1.what type of education you prefer? 28 responses




Survey result shows that 60.7% of people prefer offline mode of teaching. This shows people are more comfortable with physical classes rather than online classes

Close to 47% of the respondent gives an indication that online classes makes the child familiar with the internet beside this 36% also say that it brings indiscipline in students.





4. How much time is spent on online classes? 28 responses




Survey result from this multiple choice question exhibits the mixed reaction about the no. of hours spent on screen.

Survey shows its a mixed reaction of respondent.






7.What could be considered to be an advantage of online education 28 responses



Result clearly shows that online classes are flexible but some find it also quick, easy to use and also easy to implement


8. Disadvantage of online classes


